I was awarded the Learning Trust's Schools Plus Award for outstanding contribution to Out of Schools Learning at Hackney Museum in 2003. I have a valid CRB Enhanced Disclosure report for working with children and young people.

Projects have included

- Working and photographing in 15 London schools around issues of Inclusion and Citizenship for pupils especially those who have come to the UK as refugees/ asylum seekers. Worked across the year groups in all classes, both primary and secondary schools, produced Welcome! photo booklets and CD ROMs for educational and Curriculum use within the schools to highlight the above issues and school life. Welcome! book and teachers' resource can be purchased from The Photographers' Gallery.
- Researched, formulated, directed and produced (with Canary Wharf Arts & Events) a large-scale public photography project, enabling 500 local people, (140 individuals and rest from 26 community groups) to participate in a project which produced a view of life in Tower Hamlets in 2000. Managed all aspects of finance, outreach, directing photographers in workshops, working with designer on all design, posters, print, book, liaising with PR....
